ATTACHMENT OF TENANT DECLARATION TO  
THE APPLICATION FOR RULE FOR POSSESSION**

To invoke The Centers for Disease Control’s temporary halt to residential evictions order of September 4, 2020, a tenant must provide an executed copy of a Declaration form to the tenant’s landlord/owner/agent/property manager of the residential property where the tenant lives, or other person who has a right to have the tenant evicted or removed from where the tenant lives.

If an eviction proceeding is, or has been filed, but not ruled on, and the tenant has executed a CDC Declaration and given the Declaration to the Landlord/Owner/Agent/Property Manager, the Landlord/Owner/Agent/Property Manager must attached the tenant Declaration to the Application for Rule for Possession, or file the Declaration with the court prior to the hearing.

**VIOLATION OF THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL ORDER:**

A person violating the CDC Order may be subject to a fine of no more than \$100,000 if the violation does not result in a death or one year in jail or both, or a fine of no more than \$250,000 if the violation results in a death or one year in jail, or both, or as otherwise provided by law. An organization violating this Order may be subject to a fine of no more than \$200,000 per event if the violation does not result in a death or \$500,000 per event if the violation results in a death or as otherwise provided by law. The U. S. Department of Justice may initiate court proceedings as appropriate seeking imposition of these criminal penalties.
